About these “Spirits from the Past”

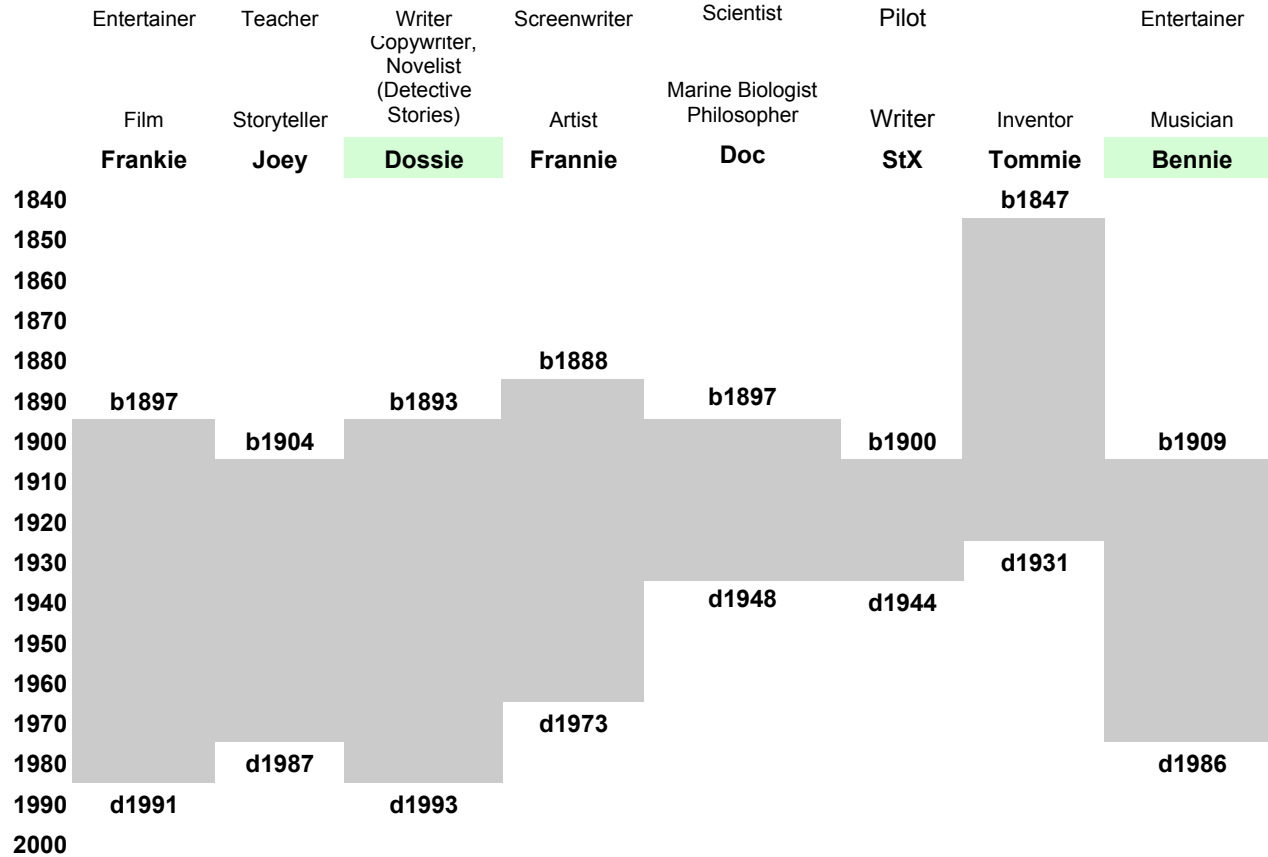
- Spirits of people who lived in the same general period of time
